The City of Pompano Beach Urban Forestry Division is teaming up with the Boy Scouts of America to celebrate our annual Arbor Day Event on Saturday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, at North Pompano Park located at 4400 NE 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

City employees will be working side-by-side with over 20 scouts plus leaders and parents from Boy Scout Troop #190 to remove invasive exotic tree species and to establish a new natural area by planting native Cypress and Red Maple trees along the lake bank.

National Arbor Day is an annual observance that celebrates the role of trees in our lives and promotes tree planting and care. Throughout the world, people of all ages are planting trees, caring for them and learning their value. The trees planted on Arbor Day show a concern for future generations.
