**ADDENDUM #5, RFP H-28-13  
LICENSE PLATE RECOGNITION SYSTEM AND/OR SECURITY CAMERAS**

To Whom It May Concern,

Please review the following questions and City responses regarding the above Request for Proposal solicitation.

1. What are the coordinates of the camera locations? Google Earth file with push pins is good too.

Response: These are approximate locations, based upon the map drawings supplied in the RFP. Actual coordinates will be determined and confirmed by the vendor following award.

2. What are the approximate heights of the poles where the PtMP radios can be mounted?

Response: The existing poles are standard light poles installed at the site by the City. A few of the recommended locations do not have an existing light pole, which would need to be provided by the City.

3. What are the coordinates of the PtMP aggregation point? What is the height the base station can be mounted? What kind of structure will the base station reside on?

Response: This is to be determined in the final design. The recommendation was to use the roof of an existing building in each Park. Height is not known.

4. What are the coordinates of the final aggregation point where all the PTP links will culminate? What is the structure type and height?

Response: The final aggregation point was recommended to be the radio tower at the Pompano Beach Police Department (Broward County Sheriff Office). Actual coordinates will be determined and confirmed by the vendor following award.

5. Is it important for the non-movable cameras to support DC voltage or is AC ok for those locations? We can support DC for the solar locations.

Response: For the non-movable cameras, the power source will be City AC power stepped down to 12/24 volts.
