GOLF CART ATTENDANT

GENERAL

Routine work in preparing, issuing and maintaining golf carts. Work is performed under direct supervision.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL DUTIES

(These are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work performed. The omission of specific duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related, or a logical assignment to the position.)

Collects tickets from golfers for cart usage and keeps record of carts issued. Checks carts for damage or mechanical problems. Removes trash. Hoses carts. Recharges batteries as needed.

Schedules carts for servicing. Assists mechanics with servicing. Keeps records on charging, maintenance and breakdowns of carts.

Replaces non-operating carts on courses, as needed.

Cleans and maintains cart shed.

Accounts for all golf carts, locks cart shed and sets alarm.

Performs related work as required.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Ability to perform limited maintenance and custodial duties. Ability to work outside under all weather conditions. Ability to follow oral and written instructions. Ability to establish rapport with the public served.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Graduation from high school or possession of an acceptable equivalency diploma. Some mechanical maintenance experience.

A comparable amount of training and experience may be substituted for the minimum qualifications.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Must have the use of sensory skills in order to effectively communicate and interact with other employees and the public through the use of the telephone and personal contact as normally defined by the ability to see, read, talk, hear, handle or feel objects and controls. Physical capability to effectively

use and operate various items of office related equipment, such as, but not limited to a, personal computer, calculator, copier, and fax machine. Significant standing, walking, moving, climbing, carrying, bending, kneeling, crawling, reaching, and handling, sitting, standing, pushing, and pulling.
