YOUR 2013 BUDGET

The City Manager and staff recently presented the Fiscal

Year 2013 Recommended Budget to the Commission. The Recommended Budget totals \$219,006,662, and this includes such services as Police, Fire, Water and Sewer, Emergency Medical Services, Parks and Recreation, Capital Improvements, etc.

In addition to continuing to provide regular services, there are several initiatives that are provided to enhance the quality of life for our residents, which include:

- New grounds equipment to maintain the City's newly renovated Greg Norman Signature Golf Course.
- Expanded lifeguard hours so residents can safely enjoy more of the City's beaches.
- New City Fire Station
- Provide funding for the development of a Cultural Arts Center.

It is important to note that the new Fire Station is not an additional facility. It will replace a current temporary facility that was utilized when Cresthaven was annexed in to the City. The new Fire Station will be paid for through an \$11 increase in the Fire Assessment Fee.

The Recommended Budget also provides for a tax rate of \$5.47 for every \$1,000 of your property's assessed value. Compared to last year, the tax rate is 5% higher; however since property values declined, the City will actually be collecting a little over 4% more in property taxes. The additional monies will be used to pay for the cost increase in police services, which increased 4.4%.

So what does this mean for you? As with most taxes, there is no simple answer. It depends when you purchased your property and how it is classified (Homestead, Commercial, etc.). For instance, if your home is a Non-Homesteaded property, or you're a more recent Homesteaded homeowner, then you may pay close to what you paid last year, plus or minus.

On the other hand, if you have lived in your home a long time and have been eligible for Save Our Home Exemptions, then you could be paying more in taxes next year. The main reason for this is that these homes are still valued below market; therefore the value of the home will increase, which for next year is 3%. As you may well know, Save Our Home Properties increase by the rate of inflation up to a cap of 3%. There are still homes, albeit not many, whose values have yet to catch up to market values.

It is important to note that when you receive your property tax bill in the mail, Pompano Beach is only a portion of that bill. In fact, on average about \$0.22 of every dollar paid in taxes goes to the City; most of it goes to the School Board and Broward County. Some additional monies may go towards the Hospital District, South Florida Water Management District, and other smaller taxing districts. Often times the City gets calls about property taxes that are not associated with the City. A contact number should be provided on your notice for each entity that plans to levy a property tax.

Finally, it is no secret that no one likes to pay property taxes, especially during tough economic times. Your elected City Commissioners recognize this and over the past five years alone have reduced budget expenses by close to \$19 million, which has helped the City maintain a low tax rate.

The City of Pompano Beach has been selected to receive a grant totaling almost \$1 Million for Education Corridor Transit Related Improvements and a Transit Systems Study for Transportation, Community and System Preservation through the Florida Highway Administration. The exact award amount is \$969,000.

The Federal Highway Administration invited states, cities, tribal governments and local planning organizations to apply for federal funding from 12 grant programs. Nearly 1,500 requests poured in from every state, Puerto Rico and Washington, D.C. totaling approximately \$2.5 billion. Grant funding was made available through enactment of the Surface Transportation Extension Act of 2012, Part II.

The Education Corridor is a linear corridor that connects educational facilities in the cities of Coral Springs, Margate, Coconut Creek and Pompano Beach. The portion of the Education Corridor in the City of Pompano Beach is known as Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard/Hammondville Road. The grant will fund construction on Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard/Hammondville Road from Powerline Road to the Turnpike and will also fund a study to research transit opportunities along the Education Corridor in the cities of Pompano Beach, Margate, Coconut Creek and potentially the City of Coral Springs.

The intent of the transit related improvements and the study are to provide greater mobility for area residents to local jobs and education opportunities. The intended result being more equitable and prosperous communities, a healthier cleaner environment and a more vibrant economy for this sector of the county. This project is an example of a City taking ownership of a county-wide redevelopment strategy and moving forward with implementation. The cities of Coconut Creek and Margate have already completed or broken ground on phases of the Education Corridor project. The Education Corridor is greater than the sum of its parts and partners. When fully implemented, the Corridor will benefit all of Broward County, economically, educationally and environmentally.

ART

CITY CREATES PUBLIC ART PROGRAM

On July 10th, the City Commission adopted an ordinance creating the City's first public art program. The purpose of the program is to enhance urban design through the creation of commissioned works of art that create a sense of place and improve the aesthetic and cultural value for residents and visitors of Pompano Beach. The program will allocate two percent of the total capital improvement budget for a public art fund. That budget will be approximately \$225,000 in fiscal year 2013.

In the upcoming months, the City Commission will consider a resolution that will establish the composition and rules governing the Public Art Committee. This committee will be charged with promoting, encouraging and advocating for public art in the City and will make appropriate recommendations to the City Commission in matters related to implementation of the Public Art Ordinance. After the resolution is adopted, the City will encourage nominations for this newly formed committee. One of the first tasks of the Public Art Committee will be to create an Art in Public Places Master Plan, which will identify locations for public artworks, establish a priority order of location and art type, and identify potential themes, concepts or goals relating to the public art program.

CRA PROGRESSES IN THE EAST & NORTHWEST

Redevelopment efforts are well underway in both Community Redevelopment Agency Districts, the East CRA and the Northwest CRA. We're certain that by now, as a resident of Pompano Beach, in some way your routine has been impacted by all the road construction, façade renovations and special events!

To recap a few of the larger projects in the East:

Pompano Beach Boulevard road construction and beach renovation will be complete this fall. While taking a stroll along the beach, you'll now see beautiful new sidewalks, a restored dune system, new grills and picnic tables and a dynamic new playground built entirely for fun. Additionally, the new Great Lawn is a fantastic place to take a picnic and enjoy the ocean breeze.

The Florida Department of Transportation project on Atlantic Boulevard is complete and now opens the way for the CRA to improve the landscape and sidewalks, making a walk down Atlantic Boulevard much more pedestrian friendly. Additionally, the parking lot and façade renovations of the Harbor Village Shoppes are scheduled to be complete by the first quarter of 2013 and we anticipate a Grand East Village Uncorked event to ring in the new year and celebrate these improvements! In the Harbor Village area, between the new Publix and Houston's, you'll enjoy the beauty of a newly designed parking lot and fountain with gorgeous landscaping, wide sidewalks and a protective

arcade to accommodate outdoor dining and a more pleasant shopping experience.

In the Northwest CRA district, the excitement is simply bigger than words! Plans are underway for the first series of groundbreaking in Downtown Pompano, beginning in September with new construction at 731 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. This building, which will be a new retail development site, is the first in a wave of redevelopment projects for the revitalization of MLK. Here's a little teaser of a few projects that will break ground in 2012-2013 in addition to the shops at 731:

Renovations to the Ali Building located at 353 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd are underway, with proposed plans to develop programming as a Cultural Arts, Museum & Events Center.

The historic Bailey Hotel located in Old Pompano at 41-51 NE 1st Street is currently undergoing renovations and being restored with many of the original façade treatments. Current plans are to develop a Creative Arts Center as the anchor for an emerging Creative Arts District with artist studio space, gallery, retail space and performance art space.

Old Pompano, build-out and development of a Shared Commercial Kitchen is also underway. This is extremely exciting as it will serve as a Small Business Incubator, promoting the concept of the creative arts district and helping to establish growth of small local businesses.

GOLF COURSE UPDATE



GRASSING UNDERWAY ON THE NEW GREG NORMAN DESIGN OF THE PINES GOLF COURSE

Grassing is now underway on the Greg Norman's redesign of the Pines Course. The Pines Course, which is located at 1101 North Federal Highway, is one of two courses at Pompano Beach Municipal Golf Course that originally opened in 1960.

Greg Norman Golf Course Design was commissioned by the City of Pompano Beach to redesign the Pines Course in an effort to modernize the facility and give the City a championship golf course that will serve as a pillar for the community, providing a first class amenity for the residents and tourists of the City of Pompano Beach. Once completed, the City of Pompano Beach will have a Greg Norman Design golf course that will likely be one of the finest municipal golf courses in the State of Florida.

Greg Norman has made several site visits to the course to review the construction progress on his Signature Design which will be his first design at a municipal golf course.

The City's new Greg Norman Design Pines Golf Course is tentatively scheduled to open in late fall of 2012.



The new Cultural Center will include; a 5,000 square foot multi-use, flexible space; 750 square foot exhibition gallery and a 2,500 square foot digital media center. The multi-use flexible space will be designed for live performances, dance, theater, film presentations, visual arts exhibitions, banquets and other special events. The main space will accommodate 400 people in theater configuration, 275 seated people at banquet tables or 500 people for standing-room events.

The total cost for the Library/Cultural Center/Civic Campus is \$18 million dollars and will be shared by Broward County, the City of Pompano Beach and the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA). The breakdown of the funding sources are the Library, \$7.2M, funded by Broward County; furnishings for Library \$3M, funded by Broward County; Cultural Center on 2nd floor, \$6M, (\$3M funded by the City; \$3M funding source to be determined) Civic Campus Master Plan, \$1.8M funded by CRA which includes surrounding facilities in addition to the Library.

Future cultural facilities in Downtown Pompano are also being planned including the second floor of the library project; the rehabilitation of the historic Hotel Bailey in the Old Pompano commercial district, and the rehabilitation and programming of the historic Ali Building on Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd./Hammondville Road. The business plans for the Ali Building and Hotel Bailey are expected to be completed in August 2013.

Construction of the Civic Campus and Library/Cultural Center is scheduled to commence in 2013 with completion anticipated in 2014.

CITY COMMISSION APPROVES CULTURAL CENTER

The Pompano Beach City Commission has approved moving forward with the schematic design of an approximately 20,000 square foot Cultural Center to be built on the second floor of the Broward County Public Library. The new two-story Library/Cultural Center will be designed in conjunction with the Master Plan for the Pompano Beach Civic Campus area South of Atlantic Boulevard between Dixie Highway and South Cypress Road, including the current site of City Hall.

BRING THE DOG

Everywhere we look, people are taking their dogs along with them wherever they go. There are a lot of opinions about what is appropriate, but from the hardware store to the grocery store or just out for a ride, we love to bring the dog and the dog loves to go with us.

Bringing along the dog is great, but please keep in mind some “**DO’S**” and “**DONT’S**” that will make your experience more enjoyable.

DO find a great place to go and have fun together. Not every place is appropriate, but the recognition of this human animal bond has resulted in some great places where pets and owners can find enjoyment together. The City of Pompano Beach’s off leash dog park, Canine Corner, has been a huge success since it opened two years ago.

DO have current rabies and ID tags on your dog. **DO** have a non-retractable leash with you at all times. Harbors Edge Park is another beautiful setting where dogs and owners can even get their feet wet on the Intracoastal beach. Pets must remain leashed at all times in this park. This park is shared with people exercising and kids playing so please **DON’T** leave your pet waste behind for others to step in.

There are many other places you’ll find to exercise with your dog. Wherever you go, **DO** be aware of the posted rules



and be courteous of others using the facilities.

DO be mindful of our intense summer temperatures. Mornings and evenings are the best times to exercise your dog. During the day, the heat can really affect your dog especially if it has a dark color coat. We have encountered many sad stories of people who mistakenly chose to exercise midday causing their dog to suffer heatstroke. Humans can sweat all over their body to transfer heat away, but a dog only transfers heat away through its nasal passages and mouth as it pants over its tongue. If you suspect your dog is overheated, get him into some cool water (not ice water) or run a hose over him to cool off. If you suspect heatstroke, get him to a veterinarian. Signs of heatstroke include: weakness/disorientation, rapid respiration, red gums, thick saliva and vomiting.

With hot temperatures in mind, **DON’T** leave the dog in the car unattended even for a few minutes. We frequently respond to calls of a dog in a parked car at a store parking lot where the owner didn’t recognize how long they were inside the store. What was intended to be

a couple minutes turns out to be 30-45 minutes. Even with the windows left slightly open, a car can quickly turn into an oven. A car left in 90 degree heat can reach temperatures of over 150 degrees quickly. Leaving a dog in an unattended vehicle without adequate ventilation or shade is animal cruelty. Leaving the car running unattended is also against the law so it’s best to keep the dog at home when going shopping.

Summer temperatures and tethering **DON’T** mix. It’s a very sad scene when an owner calls to report that someone poisoned his dog or it ate a toad. Upon arrival, we see a doghouse and water, but the dog is in direct sunlight because it’s tether is caught on something and it could not escape the sun or get to the water. It’s usually a shock to the owner when he realizes he caused his dog’s death.

BLANCHE ELY AND HER HIGH SCHOOL





The last issue of Tradewinds the early history of Pompano Beach's educational facilities as examined, focusing on the town's schools for white students. In this issue, Pompano Beach's education history continues by looking at the early development of the town's African-American schools and educators.

Until Blanche Ely High School opened in 1952, Pompano Beach's African-American students who sought a high school diploma had to enroll in a high school in Fort Lauderdale, Miami or some other town. The new high school was the result of many years of continuing community pressure and the strong will of Mrs. Blanche Ely.

During the era of segregation, the myth was that the races were separated but were provided equal facilities. No one believed it. Almost without exception, black students were given inferior buildings and instructional materials. Black educators were generally paid less than were their white counterparts and had more students in their classrooms.

Exactly when formal education began in Pompano's black community is open to debate. Some evidence indicates

that there were regular classes by 1915, but clearly by the 1920s, there was a formal school for black students in Pompano.

According to long-time Pompano Beach resident Mercerlene Alexander Rutledge, the first school serving Pompano's African-Americans was a two room, wooden building located in the 400 block of Hammondville Road. When this structure was destroyed in the 1926 hurricane, classes were held in Psalters Temple A.M.E. Church, located less than a block away. Unfortunately, the church was heavily damaged two years later by another hurricane.

Despite the discrimination and misfortune Pompano's black students had to face, the 1920s brought at least one fortunate change. In 1923 a young teacher came to Pompano. Born in the small central Florida town of Reddick in 1904, she would later graduate from Florida A & M College.

Blanche General Ely was a woman who was not given to deep self-doubts. She saw her role as more expansive than being an academic instructor, although she did not shirk that duty. Rather, she felt that she had to use her talents to provide children in her community the tools they would need to make it in a world in which many forces were at work to insure their failure.

Hers was a 24 hours-a-day, 365 days-a-year calling. Any number of her former students still recall that if Mrs. Ely caught you doing something you shouldn't be doing, anywhere in town, it didn't matter if school was in session or not -- punishment would follow.

Although Blanche Ely differed with Booker T. Washington in some areas, she closely followed Washington's philosophy of making the best of a bad situation and that

the black community must develop, on its own, an economic foundation and social stability in order to move forward. No doubt, she was in agreement with Washington when he said, "Character, not circumstances, make the man". She would be a force in the community until her death, seven decades after she first arrived in Pompano.

The Broward County Board of Public Instruction (School Board) budgeted for a new school in Pompano's black community during the 1927-28 school year – it opened as the Pompano Colored School at 718 NW 6th Street. Mrs. Ely was selected to be the school's principal. In 1954, this facility was renamed Coleman Elementary School, in honor of Rev. James Emanuel Coleman, pastor of Pompano's Mount Calvary Baptist Church.

Prior to the Second World War, two other schools were established for Pompano's black students whose families worked in the agricultural fields. One was located west of town off today's State Road 7 and was known as the Hammondville School. The other was located in the migrant labor camp on Hammondville Road just east of today's Powerline Road.

The burden that these African-American schools worked under can be seen by teacher-student ratios reported by the Board of Public Instruction in 1938. Pompano white schools collectively had one teacher for every 25 students, while the Pompano Colored School had one teacher for every 54 students. At the Hammondville School, the single teacher employed there had 67 students.

In the fall of 1951, Pompano Beach acquired its second high school when Blanche Ely's lobbying for a new school that would be able to grant to its students high school diplomas was approved by the Broward School Board. At the insistence of the community, the school was named for Mrs. Ely. Over the years, she had not wavered in her commitment to providing her students with the best educational environment available and character-building.


In 1954, the United States Supreme Court's ruling in *Brown vs. Board of Education* held that schools that were racially separate were inherently unequal. Despite the court's order, the Broward County School Board did just about everything it could

to keep the schools segregated. Mrs. Ely did not object to separate facilities as much as she did the unequal resources provided to the county's black public schools. In 1957, the Broward County School Board attempted to transfer Mrs. Blanche Ely from her position as principal of Blanche Ely High School in Pompano Beach to a lesser position in Hallandale. Many were convinced that this was an attempt to punish Mrs. Ely for being so outspoken. The ruling was appealed all the way to the State Board of Education, which overruled the transfer.

By the end of the 1960s, it was clear that the county schools would have to integrate. The problem for Pompano Beach was that demographic changes and housing patterns made it difficult to keep two high schools open. Following the 1969-70 school year, Blanche Ely High School was closed. Most Ely students went to Pompano Beach High School the following year. Mrs. Ely and community leaders instituted a lawsuit against the closing, and the high school was reopened in 1974.

When the school was reopened the name had been shortened to Ely High School. Although the School Board said the name change was to honor both Joseph and Blanche Ely, many in the community saw it as an intentional slight to Mrs. Ely. In 1999, the name was changed back to Blanche Ely High School.

Blanche Ely died on December 23, 1993, and is buried in Pompano Beach's Forest Lawn Cemetery.

PERMIT *EXPEDITER* PROGRAM

Need help processing your permit? Ask someone in a yellow shirt!

We know that obtaining building permits can sometimes be a confusing and frustrating process, especially if you don't know how to navigate the system. The City of Pompano Beach Development Services Department recently hired four permit expeditors who are given one goal: ease the building permit process.



The Permit Expediter Program has been in existence for a little over a year now. Its objective is to help applicants with the building permit process. Our trained team of permit expeditors can be easily recognized by their yellow shirts. They are available to meet with applicants to provide a preliminary review of applications and communicate information about our permit process. They also conduct project research and help with paperwork, in order to allow plan reviewers more time to review your building permit. These efforts all help streamline the permitting process, so you get your permit sooner.

Since this program was implemented, our plan reviewers are now able to review more permits daily, and the turnaround time for permits has significantly been reduced. The permit expeditors will also be instrumental in ensuring a smooth and seamless transition to the ePlan program.



BULLYING IS PREVENTABLE



As the 2012/2013 school year gets underway, it is important that parents are aware of the Broward County School District's strict Anti-Bullying Policy. The policy prohibits bullying of, or by any district student or employee. Since knowledge is power, it is vital that parents become familiar with the policy, which is sent home with every Broward County student the first week of school for parental and student review.

Bullying among children is aggressive behavior that is intentional and involves an imbalance of power or strength. A child who is being bullied has a hard time defending him or herself. Usually, bullying is repeated over time. Bullying can take many forms such as: physical, verbal, emotional and cyber-bullying. There are signs you can look for to know if your child is being bullied:

**Torn Clothes - Loss of Appetite - Reluctance to go to School
Mood Changes - Bruises or Injuries that can't be Explained**

If you suspect your child is being bullied, it is important to talk with your child, be supportive and gather information about the bullying. All suspected bullying should

be reported to your child's school. You can also make an anonymous report by calling the district's emergency hotline at 754.321.0911 or by visiting broward-schools.com.

Face-to-face bullying isn't the only way children can be victimized. Many children and young adults are using their computers and cell phones to send or post text or images intended to hurt or embarrass their classmates. This includes sending mean, vulgar or threatening messages and images; posting sensitive or private information about another person; or pretending to be someone else in order to make that person look bad. Children and teens can cyber-bully each other through e-mails, instant messaging, text messages, web pages, blogs or chat rooms. If your child is a victim of such bullying, remember to:

- encourage your child not to respond to cyber-bullying
- do not erase the messages or pictures (*save these as evidence*)
- try to identify the individual doing the cyber-bullying
- consider filing a complaint with your service provider to block the sender
- contact your child's school
- contact law enforcement if cyber-bullying involves acts such as threats of violence, extortion, obscene or harassing phone calls or text messages, stalking, hate crimes or child pornography

All parents are encouraged to talk to their children about what it means to hurt another. For more information about ways to prevent bullying, please visit sheriff.org/antibullying.

HAVING TROUBLE MAKING YOUR MORTGAGE PAYMENTS?

You may qualify for Hardest-Hit Program Financial Assistance



The City of Pompano Beach Office of Housing and Urban Improvement is working with the State of Florida to help pay the mortgages of qualified homeowners who are unemployed or underemployed through no fault of their own.

The Florida Hardest-Hit Fund Program aims to assist qualified Florida homeowners by providing mortgage assistance for up to 12 months or until the homeowner finds adequate employment to resume paying the mortgage with up to \$18,000 available to reinstate a delinquent first mortgage prior to payments being made. Additionally, for a homeowner who is recovering from unemployment/underemployment, up to \$25,000 is available as a one-time payment to reinstate a delinquent first mortgage.



CROWDSOURCING: Public Participation In The Social Media Age

Local governments are always searching for better ways to engage their residents and citizens so that the government can truly reflect their will. In the past, these efforts have focused primarily on public opinion surveys, focus groups and public meetings. While these still have value, the emergence of social media has created new forms for interaction. In addition to Facebook and Twitter, one of the most interesting and community building forms for interaction is crowdsourcing.

You will be able to offer new ideas during the course of the five weeks and vote (or change your vote) on various ideas during the course of the five weeks.

The seven questions are:

1. What is one action we could take to attract more jobs to Pompano Beach?
2. What is one additional feature that would make the beach attractive to both residents and tourists?
3. What is one action we should take to make the City a good place for ourselves, our children and grandchildren to live?
4. What is one action we should take to beautify the City?
5. What is one action we should take to unify the City?
6. What is the most important information the City needs to communicate to its residents?
7. What is the City service that can be most improved?

You can offer as many ideas as you want. However, please offer only one idea at a time since people are commenting and voting. If two different ideas are put in the same submittal, we won't be able to tell which idea people are voting for or against.

At the end of the five weeks, we will keep the website live for two additional weeks for final ideas and voting. Then the website will be closed and the results tabulated for use in the strategic planning process. 




All of our Ocean Lifeguards are certified First Responders or Emergency Medical Technicians who are trained to handle any emergency and are equipped with full basic life support equipment such as AED's and oxygen. Our agency's lifeguard

certification is provided through the United States Lifesaving Association. Ocean-Rescue Lifeguards receive extensive training with Pompano Beach Fire-Rescue. Our Ocean Lifeguards also have extensive knowledge of the ocean and beach environment and are always happy to answer questions from the public.

Team Pompano brought 60 competitors to this event, with nearly 50 placing in the top five and 35 juniors in the top three. In the distance swim, Pompano had a clean sweep in the B Division ages 12-13. The first 6 swimmers were Team Pompano with one swimmer being a female competitor.

One of the most popular events, the distance paddle, was won by last year's winner and reigning State Champion Konnor Katzmark, who is in the A Division ages 14-17. This involves starting on the shoreline and paddling on a foam board around three orange buoys totaling a distance of 800 meters.

With all the hard work and dedication in the summer sessions, Team Pompano achieved the highest points in this year's competition earning them 1st place and State Champions.

Flood Damage Protect Your Home and Property

This article is required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (F.E.M.A.) to satisfy provisions in the Community Rating System (C.R.S.) for reduced costs for flood insurance. The following is offered to Pompano Beach residents to help prevent and minimize the impact on lives and property caused by floodwaters.

Flood Hazard Map

The City's Engineering Department has enhanced FEMA's Flood Criteria Map identifying flood zones for all properties in the city. The map depicts the flood hazard associated with any parcel in the City. The map is located in the Building Inspections Division at City Hall and is available in electronic GIS format.

Flood Risk

Although we have been relatively fortunate for many years, the recent flooding on Halloween 2011 reminds us of the possibility of a flooding event without a major storm or hurricane.

Flood Warning System

The City of Pompano Beach, in coordination with Broward County, has a warning system to notify residents of impending flood danger. Warnings will be transmitted on public address systems, television, radio, telephone and on a door-to-door basis. Listen for instructions during times of flood risk.

Flood Safety

These are precautionary steps to consider before possible flooding:

- Listen to radio or television for warnings.
- Obey warning and evacuation instructions from disaster officials.
- Know your evacuation zone and route.
- Take your own essentials (food, toiletries, clothes, blankets, etc.).
- Turn off the electricity and gas before leaving your home.
- Bring a battery-operated flashlight.
- Be careful at all times, particularly at night, and try to remain calm.

Flood Insurance

Most homeowners' insurance policies do not cover property losses due to flood waters. To insure your property for flood damage, you need a flood insurance policy. If you do not have valid flood insurance, contact an agent immediately. Property owners can insure property; renters can insure possessions. The City of Pompano Beach participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (N.F.I.P.) to provide city residents with the initial qualification to purchase flood insurance. We applied to F.E.M.A. for participation in the C.R.S. program to enable our residents to qualify for lower flood insurance premiums.

Property Protection

There are ways to minimize property losses from flood damage, including:

- Move furniture and other household valuables to rooms or spaces in the upper story of a two-story dwelling or a location higher than the regular floor elevation in a single story home.
- Place sandbags in strategic places around your property prior to flood status. When sandbags are placed correctly at proper locations, they can slow up and divert flood waters.
- Upgrading your property can include building flood walls, elevating a structure or raising the floor.

Development Permits

All development (new construction, additions, renovations, alterations to properties, etc.) in the City of Pompano Beach require a construction permit. The N.F.I.P. and the Florida Building Code require the entire building to conform to the requirements for a new building when building repairs or alterations exceed 50 percent of the building's market value. All applicable building permit applications must conform to this requirement when submitted to the Building Inspections Division. The requirement may also apply if a building is substantially damaged due to flooding.

Stormwater Management

Stormwater is managed through a system of pipes and drainage canals maintained regularly by our Public Works and Utilities Departments. The Broward County Office of Environmental Services and South Florida Water Management District. Constant water flow through these canals, especially during



heavy storms, is essential to flood prevention in the City. City and state laws prohibit dumping trash in waterways. Report violators to Public Works Department at 954-786-4060.

Natural Habitat

State regulations protect those natural areas that help to reduce the risks associated with flooding. Along the beach, no new structures are permitted seaward of the Coastal Construction Line without permission. Other restrictions protect some wetland areas from development.

Rate Reductions

On June 11th, 1993, F.E.M.A. awarded the City with a Class 9 rating in the C.R.S. This rating earned Pompano Beach residents a five percent discount on flood insurance premiums. In September 1994, the City received official notification that Pompano Beach residents are eligible for an additional five percent discount, or ten percent total, on flood insurance based on the City complying with the requirements for a Class 8 rating in the C.R.S. In July 2012, F.E.M.A. awarded the City a class 7 rating so flood insurance policy holders in special flood hazard areas in the City will now receive a 15% discount on their insurance premiums.

Additional Information

We urge City residents to contact or visit the Building Inspections Division to determine the flood zone and flood elevation for their property. The library at the Building Inspections Division is available for your reference. Pompano Beach City Hall is at 100 West Atlantic Boulevard, Pompano Beach, Florida. The Pompano Beach Branch of the Broward County Library, located at 1213 East Atlantic Boulevard, has information on flood insurance, flood protection and flood plain management.




