# CITY HIRES TOURISM MARKETING MANAGER

**T**he City of Pompano Beach has hired a new Tourism Marketing Manager. Lidia Gorzelany, with over 25 years of tourism experience in both the domestic and international markets, Lidia was appointed earlier this year with the approval of the City Commission. Gorzelany has been working to increase visibility and visitor growth to the City, which includes collaborating with the Greater Ft. Lauderdale Convention and Visitors Bureau and Visit Florida. Tourism collateral and promotional ads have been produced to help attract visitors to the City of Pompano Beach. The tourist guide features all the City's tourism assets. A perfect tool to help promote the City at various tourism sales missions, trade shows and events. This guide also helps tourists already in the area, see what the City of Pompano Beach has to offer. A new tourism web page has been created and added to the City's web site [pompanobeachfl.gov](http://pompanobeachfl.gov) listing Pompano Beach hotels, restaurants, attractions, etc.

A common theme has been established for all promotions, "Beach, Sun, Fun, and Adventure." To compliment the tourist guide, a series of ads have been placed in local tourism publications, as well as in the Greater Fort Lauderdale Convention and Visitors Bureau Hello Sunny Vacation Planner which are distributed domestically and internationally.

A new tourism video featuring the City's tourism assets is featured on the City website, [pompanobeachfl.gov](http://pompanobeachfl.gov), Channel 78, YouTube and social media. It will also be available to the City of Pompano Beach hotels to use as a promotional video for their guests.

The Tourism Manager is working with local tourism partners to help increase the number of visitors to the City of Pompano Beach, Florida's Warmest Welcome.



It is the first time in our 100 year history that the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Department has prepared a Parks Master Plan. The City Commission formally approved the Parks Master Plan at the July 23rd City Commission Meeting. In February 2012, the Department embarked on the preparation of a comprehensive City Wide Parks Master Plan in order to address latent community parks and recreation needs and provide a professionally prepared roadmap to improve public recreation and leisure facilities throughout the community.

The City Wide Parks Master Plan is intended to provide an evaluation of existing park conditions as well as identify area and city-wide park needs. As part of the Master Plan process, these considerations were presented in a community forum to gather citizen's preferences in order to improve recreation facilities and program offerings in both short and long term horizons. With this intent in mind, the goals established for the City Wide Parks Master Plan were further defined to more clearly understand the purpose. These goals were to:

# CITY APPROVES PARKS MASTER PLAN

- Expand as needed the city-wide system of park and recreation venues to meet the needs of the citizens of Pompano Beach
- Enhance the quality of life of all citizens
- Improve the neighborhoods

To assist in reaching these goals a series of specific guiding objectives were established to:

- Identify perceived and real community recreation needs
- Maximize, to the greatest extent possible, the use of available recreation lands/facilities resources
- Provide for the rational and equitable distribution of recreational facilities throughout the City of Pompano Beach and improve accessibility
- Plan park and recreation investments to create the greatest benefit for all citizens of Pompano Beach, while limiting duplication of high maintenance facilities


The City Wide Park Master Plan provides park and recreation development policies, programs, and specific park conceptual designs.

Through the Master Plan analysis process a number of needed projects were identified. Conceptual designs were prepared for each of the projects identified. The design process involved further analysis of identified program needs and site conditions.

The design concepts presented are identified by each specific Commission District. These projects are:

- **District 1:** Beach Community Center
- **District 2:** Cresthaven Community Center, North Pompano Park Aquatic and Community Centers, Highlands Teen Center
- **District 3:** Norwood Pines Park Expansion
- **District 4:** Apollo Park Expansion
- **District 5:** McNair Park Expansion, Collier City Mini-Park, 10 Acre Potential Park

# YOUR 2014 Budget


## Total City Budget



To put this in perspective, inflation alone – as measured by the Consumer Price Index - increased by 1.7%.


City staff recently adopted its Fiscal Year 2014 Budget. The Adopted Budget totals \$220,505,844, which represents an increase of 0.68% compared to last year's adopted budget.

The budget funds such services as Police, Fire, Water and Sewer, Emergency Medical Services, Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts, Capital Improvements, etc. However, the proposed budget also includes funding for a number of initiatives that will improve the City and enhance the quality of life for residents; this includes:



The Adopted Recommended Budget provides for a tax rate of \$5.37 for every \$1,000 of your property's assessed value. As you can see on the chart, the proposed tax rate decreased compared to last year (approximately 1.81%). Overall, the City has consistently maintained a low tax rate.

Now, does this mean you'll pay less property taxes to the City next fiscal year? In many cases, yes. Those properties that may end up paying more property taxes to the City next year are likely to be non-homesteaded residential properties; these properties are not covered under Save Our Homes, which limits assessed valuation increases to the CPI or 3% (whichever is less). During calendar year 2012, non-homesteaded residential property values increased over 5%.



It is important to note that when you receive your property tax bill in the mail Pompano Beach is only a portion of that bill. In fact, on average about \$0.24 of every dollar paid in taxes goes to the City; most of it goes to the School Board and Broward County. Some additional monies may go towards the Hospital District, South Florida Water Management District, and other smaller taxing districts. Often times the City gets calls about property taxes that are not associated with the City. A contact number should be provided on your notice for each entity that plans on levying a property tax.

## City of Pompano Beach




In September, the City Commission approved a Strategic Plan for the City. The intent of the Strategic Plan is to provide a pathway to a more prosperous, diverse, and attractive city. The continuance of these efforts is critical for Pompano Beach to position itself as both a strong tourism market and central site for the various products and services that will be generated in the regional economy. Pompano Beach has the assets needed to become a dynamic economic space bringing better jobs and quality of life experiences for its residents.

**A**s many of you know, the Canine Corner Dog Park has remained closed due to high water for some time now. While the closure has been inconvenient and disappointing to our four legged friends, it has been necessary to allow the park some time to heal and act in the capacity for which it was designed, water retention. Now that the rainy season is about to end, we expect to open the park as soon as the ground water dissipates or we open the expansion section. That's right! We are finally capable of starting construction with a goal of completion by December 1<sup>st</sup>. In case you didn't know, we are expanding the fence of the large dog section to the north towards the lake. This should result in limited closures because of the area's high ground. From now on, when we see wear and tear, or water starts to rise, we will simply close that section and open the other. And since the large dogs have their place, so will the small dogs. We look forward to your return.

# OLD DOGS *NEW TRICKS*

**F**or the last twenty six years that I have worked for the City of Pompano Beach, Animal Care and Regulation has had a shelter located off Powerline Road between Copans and Sample Roads. That shelter was a place to recover a lost pet, adopt a new pet, or where you could take a deceased pet for cremation. Unfortunately, the County has closed the Pompano Beach shelter and has made a recent policy change that they will no longer provide services for collection or disposal of dead animals.

That doesn't mean that you will not be able to adopt or locate a lost pet, it just means that you will have to travel to Fort Lauderdale for those services. As it relates to the City of Pompano Beach's Animal Control services, nothing has changed. We still provide the same level of service. So if you're troubled by a stray or injured pet, if wildlife has you concerned, or something has died you can still count on us to be there.

As it relates to the deceased pet or an animal that has been found in the street dead, we have adjusted our procedures to accommodate the County's change in policy. However, there are some things to know and consider when your pet departs. The City of Pompano Animal Control will continue to offer a dead animal removal service for pet owners who request help before decomposition sets in. The difference being that the animals will no longer be cremated in the County incinerator. Changes will likely mean deceased animals are buried at the landfill. If cremation is your desired outcome, you must depend on your local Veterinarian or Crematory service. These services are available at a cost with transportation being the owner's responsibility.

# City Approved for .GOV Address

As a part of the newly designed and upgraded website, the City of Pompano Beach has a new domain name consistent with government entities: **pompanobeachfl.gov**.

All services including Electronic Plan Review, on-line bill pay and recreational event sign-ups will need to be completed through the new domain. Those who have the web site bookmarked or have it listed in their "Favorites" will need to change to the new domain name.

The domain name GOV is a sponsored top-level domain in the Domain Name System of the Internet. The GOV name is derived from government, indicating its restricted use by government entities in the United States. The Gov domain is administered by the General Services Administration, an independent agency of the United States Federal Government.

The City of Pompano Beach is proud to have obtained the GOV domain designation in its on-going effort to be consistent and transparent to citizens seeking information about our City.



## Yes, the grass is sometimes greener... and it should be yours!

It's a simple question: what do the Greg Norman Signature Golf Course, Sample-McDougald House with its herb and vegetable garden, Sand & Spurs Equestrian Park, the City's nursery, ball fields and parks have in common? They are all watered with OASIS reuse water.

The City of Pompano Beach has been using reuse water over 24 years and it shows: lush green grass that needs less fertilizer, can be watered any day, is less expensive in maintenance, and is safe and environmentally friendly.

We get our drinking water from the Biscayne aquifer, which is right beneath your feet. By saving drinking water for drinking, and using reuse water for grass, over 10 billion gallons of water from the Biscayne Aquifer has been conserved. This reduction in water withdrawals has resulted in a reversal of the saltwater encroachment upon the well fields and protects the aquifer.

Plus there are savings on your water bill: the price of reuse water starts at \$0.85/1000 gallons, and the price of drinking water starts at \$2.24/1000 gallons. Depending on the size of your lawn and how often you water, your savings could be substantial.

It's easy to get connected: you just fill out one simple form, have it notarized and send it to the address mentioned on the form, or stop by Customer Service at City Hall where they can notarize it for you. # PROGRESS IN POMPANO

## [ New PIER Street ]

Pier Street is a new street being designed in Pompano Beach with a “Complete Streets” concept which takes into consideration all users. “Complete Streets” are designed and operated to enable safe access with everyone in mind including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists and transit riders of all ages and abilities. Complete Streets make it easy to cross the street, walk to shops, and bicycle to work. They allow buses to run on time and make it safe for people to walk to and from train stations. Pier Street will be designed to have on-street parking, wide sidewalks, landscaped pedestrian areas and a signalized intersection and cross-walk on A1A. Pier Street will connect the Pier property with the Oceanside Park on the west side of A1A and the small park on the Intracoastal, west of Riverside Drive. Landscaping and tree canopy will be added along the newly designed street, to improve the vicinity around the Intracoastal Waterway.

In addition, improvements will be made around the new library site and, of course, within the pier parking lot which will be transformed from a parking lot with little green space to a pedestrian-oriented destination with over 25% green space.

The redevelopment of the Pier parking lot is just one part of the new urbanistic projects between the ocean and the Intracoastal which will retrofit this predominantly vehicular oriented area by creating a destination, not only for tourists and beach-goers, but for the thousands of condominium residents within a quarter mile walk of the pier parking lot. Currently, these residents must drive across the Intracoastal bridge on Atlantic Boulevard or drive south on A1A to find retail and dining destinations. This project will create a walkable destination that is just an elevator ride away.

The new Pier Street will also provide an incentive for residents living in the neighborhoods between US1 and A1A to walk or bike along the newly redeveloped Atlantic Boulevard. This segment of roadway was also a “Complete Street” design. Pedestrians will cross the Intracoastal bridge to Riverside Drive or A1A, then take Pier Street to retail and dining destinations or simply to enjoy the beach.

Transforming a surface parking lot, like the Pier parking lot, into a retail and dining destination and connecting that destination with a walkable street like Pier Street is a case-study in Smart Growth and represents the perfect formula for retrofitting an auto oriented community into a safe and accessible community for everyone.

# [ Project Updates ]



## 731 Retail Shoppes:

This project includes construction of a 4,140 square foot new commercial building, reconfiguration of a City parking lot to include 41 parking spaces, as well as landscape and hardscape improvements to the site. The shell and site work for this project are nearly complete. Five of the six tenant spaces have already been leased, including Betty's Soul Food, and are expected to open this Fall/Winter.



## MLK Streetscape Improvement:

The water main and sewer facilities installation along MLK Blvd between Dixie Highway and NW 6th Avenue is almost complete! The work, encompassing major upgrades to both facilities, is the first step towards improving the corridor and enhancing the area in anticipation of significant development by private investors.

This phase will be followed by streetscape improvements including upgrades to drainage facilities, sidewalk replacement, installation of new light fixtures and a lush landscape theme and will include roadway alignment and pavement restoration as part of the overall design. The full project is expected to be complete by the end of June 2014.



## Old Pompano Streetscape Project:

In Old Pompano, a new sanitary sewer was installed along Flagler Avenue connecting to the existing system on Atlantic Boulevard. In addition, the CRA's contractor completed installation of a new water

main on NE 1 Street and NE 1 Avenue as well as upgrades in the alleyway connecting Flagler Avenue and NE 1 Avenue. These improvements will pave the way to support a number of new restaurants planned for the area and scheduled to be open and operational in the next 24 months. Moreover, the Hotel Bailey and old bank facilities will benefit from these upgrades as the old system was rendered obsolete and insufficient. Similarly to MLK Boulevard, the bulk of the proposed streetscape improvements work will resume in late September and continue until mid-2014.



## Ali Cultural Arts Center:

Construction on the existing building (phase 1 of the project) is underway, with a plan for substantial completion in early 2014. During this time the CRA has been working with designers and the Zoning Department for approval and have received the go ahead on the plans. These additions to the site, which include new structures, outdoor stage and a parking lot will take approximately 9 months to complete after permitting, so get ready to see some major changes in the next few months with a planned opening date in late 2014!



## Hotel Bailey:

Renovations are almost complete for the Hotel Bailey Arts Center, with most of the façade complete and the majority of interior work nearly done. The CRA is already speaking with consultants for management and will be looking for local artists to occupy the 15 independent artist studios in the very near future.

# NO CHILD INSIDE

Creating Awareness About the Dangers of Leaving Children in Hot Vehicles

**23** That's the number of children that have died in only seven months this year throughout the U.S. due to heatstroke from being left unattended inside of hot vehicles. Three of these deaths have occurred in the state of Florida.

In 2003, the Pompano Beach Fire Rescue responded to a child locked inside of a vehicle at a commercial parking lot. Unfortunately, too much time had passed and the child was unable to be revived despite the paramedics' best efforts. Fortunately, that has been the only tragic death the City of Pompano Beach has experienced, but in the past three years Pompano Beach Fire Rescue has responded to nearly 180 incidents of children locked inside of a vehicle. That's an average of 1.2 incidents per week (15 per month) over the past three years. These incidents continue to occur week after week.

So why do these incidents occur? On many occasions, the caregiver accidentally locks their keys inside their car and immediately realizes it. However, research has shown that amazingly enough, the grim reality is that many caregivers get caught up in the fast paced multi-tasked society and they simply forget the sleeping child in the back seat.

Since 1990, the U.S. has experienced 584 heatstroke deaths due to being left inside a hot vehicle. Out of these deaths, 303 have occurred because the caregiver forgot the child was inside the vehicle. Although it is difficult to imagine someone forgetting their child, you cannot dispute the facts. Another cause of death is due to children playing around unlocked vehicles, climbing inside and then they are unable to get out. The U.S. has experienced 166 of these deaths.

As a result of these staggering statistics, Pompano Beach Fire Rescue is the first fire department organization in the U.S. to embark on a program to create awareness about the dangers of leaving children in hot vehicles. After conducting extensive research, including polling 400 random Pompano Beach residents over a six month period, the No Child Locked Inside program began.

The goal of the program is to create awareness and reduce the number of children that are left inside of hot vehicles through the use of informational handouts. No Child Locked Inside stickers will also be placed in street front businesses to serve as a reminder in case someone accidentally forgets their child inside the vehicle. Additionally, No Child Locked Inside stickers will be placed in all City run buildings in Pompano Beach.



>> Here are a few safety tips you can use on a daily basis to help you during those hectic days:

1. Leave something you need in the back seat of your car (purse, briefcase, etc.)
2. Stuffed animal in child seat when unoccupied and stuffed animal in front seat when child seat is occupied
3. Get in the habit of always opening the rear door when leaving the car
4. Use drive-thru windows whenever possible
5. Avoid talking on the phone and texting while driving to avoid distractions
6. Keep vehicle locked when at home/ garage
7. Arrange to have the day care center or babysitter call you if you do not show up by a certain time

## >> What you should you know?

1. The temperature inside of a car can rise:
  - a. 20 degrees in 10 minutes
  - b. 30 degrees in 20 minutes
  - c. 35 degrees in 30 minutes
  - d. 45 degrees in 60 minutes
2. Normal body temperature is 98.6 degrees. 104 degrees with no sweating can cause heat stroke and lead to death at 107 degrees

# POMPANO'S BEACH:

## PART 1

At the beginning of the twentieth century, the area south of the Hillsboro Inlet that today is often referred to as the “barrier island” (the land between the Intracoastal Waterway and the Atlantic Ocean) was for all practical purposes uninhabited. At that time much of South Florida was just opening up to settlement, but few pioneers who set their roots in this area saw the beach as a hospitable place to homestead.

The beach area’s drawbacks included its distance from the Pompano settlement along the railroad tracks and the lack of a bridge across the canal that separated it from the mainland. Much of the land was unsuitable for farming, the region’s main economic activity, and frequent Atlantic storms made any enterprise that close to the beach especially vulnerable to destructive winds and water.

In the early 1900s a day at the beach was decidedly different than it is today. Pompano residents might follow

a narrow path to the waterway that separated the mainland from the barrier island, boat across it, and then trek from the swampy western edge of the island to the beach. Once there the favored activities were fishing, cook outs (often fish fries), scavenging for items that had washed ashore from shipwrecks and, less frequently, wading in the ocean. Sunbathing was considered unhealthy and would have been problematic as both men and women were almost always clothed from head to toe.

In 1906, workmen arrived at the mouth of the Hillsboro Inlet to prepare the site for a long-awaited lighthouse that would warn sailors and ships away from the treacherous offshore reefs. When the lighthouse became operational, this area had its first permanent beach residents, even though they were living there as government employees.

One of the first beach area pioneer families was that of Exum Jelks. Members of the Jelks family began spending the winter in Pompano as early as 1904. Around 1907, Exum Jelks pur-

chased 100 acres of ocean front property for \$2,000.00. His land was located south of today's Atlantic Boulevard. Jelks subdivided the property into parcels consisting of 100 feet of ocean frontage, 350 feet in depth, with 5 acres of muck farming land on the canal. Parcels sold for \$400.00, and soon there were five houses under construction (it is unclear if they ever had permanent residents) along with a communal dining structure and a dock on the waterway.

Just south of the Jelks' property, brothers Robert and William McNab owned land east of the waterway that they attempted to farm. Other pioneer residents purchased land along the beach, but few made any attempt to develop their holdings.

During the 1920s, the era of the Florida Land Boom, there were a number of schemes to create residential developments on the beach. Land was cleared, in some cases roadways were built, promotional schemes were unleashed on the gullible, and although some lots were sold, few who purchased a lot ever built on it. The twenties did bring several improvements: in 1925 a bridge was constructed to span the Hillsboro Inlet (a bridge over the waterway to the mainland had been completed in the 19-teens) and the same year a hotel was completed just off the beach near today's NE 16th Street. Owned by members of the Jelks family, the Wahoo Lodge offered upscale accommodations for visitors seeking an "off the beaten track" vacation.

By the 1920s, "sea bathing" had become increasingly popular and to serve those who wished to enjoy a day at the beach, an iconic structure, the Pompano Casino, was built by the pioneer Blount brothers (George, J. DeVotie and William) where today's Atlantic Boulevard meets the ocean. At that time, the term "casino" was traditionally used to describe a building devoted to "social amusement," not necessarily gambling. The wooden structure offered a place for beach-goers to change clothes, a restaurant and a meeting room on the second floor. It was one of the very few buildings along the oceanfront open to the general public.

With the coming of the Great Depression, what little activity there was on the beach came to a halt. Hundreds, if not thousands, of people lost all they had invested in the beachfront developments. As land prices plummeted, indi-

viduals with capital scooped up properties at bargain prices. One such person was William L. Kester, who would eventually own most of what is today Pompano Beach's public oceanfront. Kester came to this area in the early 1920s and proved to be not only a shrewd businessman, but also a civic leader and philanthropist. At the height of the Depression he decided to encourage tourism by building dozens of small wood-frame cottages along A1A, facing the ocean. Quickly given the name "Kester Cottages," they proved to be popular with both tourists and local residents, leading Kester to build additional cottages in town.

By the final years of the 1930s, more vacationers were finding Pompano's beach, leading to the construction of additional accommodations, such as the Silver Thatch Inn. At this time a few private oceanfront homes were also being constructed. The optimism of the late 1930s was soon dashed, however, as the United States was plunged into war and the beach became an armed camp.

Just days following the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, security measures were instituted along the Atlantic coast. Armed guards were stationed on the bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway. Soon anyone crossing the bridge to the beach had to have a pass. During evening hours, only those who lived on the beach or had official business there were allowed to proceed.

By the summer of 1942, security concerns led to the establishment of volunteer horse patrols along the lower Florida shoreline. Pompano residents responded enthusiastically, becoming the first community in southern Florida to place its unit in the field ready for service. Soon, these volunteer horse patrols were replaced by mounted U. S. Coast Guardsmen. Housed at the Silver Thatch Inn, every evening the Guardsmen covered the beach south to Fort Lauderdale and north to the Boca Raton Inlet.

Throughout the war, Pompano volunteers were stationed on the beach to watch out for German U-boats and (more unlikely) enemy aircraft. Those who volunteered for this program remember long, lonely nights during which one's imagination could give rise to all sorts of concerns.

As the war finally came to a close, Pompano residents expected things to return to normal, but those who lived on the beach foresaw another conflict on the horizon – this one between the beach residents and those they referred to as Pompano's "old timers."



On September 23rd, the City of Pompano Beach tested the CodeRED Emergency Notification System by calling the entire community. CodeRED is a high-speed notification system capable of reaching millions of citizens in minutes. It enables local government officials to communicate time-sensitive, personalized messages via voice, email and text messaging. You can add as many contact numbers as you wish, including cellular phones and other non-traditional phones.

Don't miss important messages during an emergency. Log onto the City of Pompano Beach's website at [pompano-beachfl.gov](http://pompano-beachfl.gov) and follow the CodeRED link on the top right corner of the page. Required information includes a street address for location purposes and a primary phone number. Additional phone numbers, email addresses and text addresses may also be entered. The numbers go directly into the Emergency Communications Network database and are not visible or available to anyone else.

Mayor Lamar Fisher is urging the community to be prepared, "All individuals and businesses should take the time to visit our website and add contact information. If your contact information is not in the database, you will not receive a call when an urgent message is sent. In particular, those who have unlisted phone numbers, new phone numbers, and those who use a cellular phone as their primary numbers should make sure they are in the City's database." Fisher said.

The 2013 Pompano Proud WOW Award for home beautification has been presented to Julio Acevedo of 1283 SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Street in Lyons Park.

When the Acevedo family purchased their home in 1983, it came with typical Florida landscaping which consisted of a few palm trees and lots of grass. Julio maintained his yard and many of his neighbor's yards. He had a dream of one day starting his own landscaping company. For over 20 years now, Julio has owned his own successful lawn company living that dream.

This property is a perfect example of well-kept mature growth, which is one of Julio's talents. He knows where to place landscaping so it will be there for a long time. The invasive Ficus bushes were removed and replaced with a fence, the perfect support for flowering vines.

Gumbo Limbos, Purple Tabebuias, and Florida friendly shrubs were planted in the surrounding swale adding native beauty to this corner lot. There are over a dozen palms on the property. The native Slash Pine which once were the main trees in this area still stands majestically in the backyard and ospreys are often seen perched high on its branches.

The Eugenia Hedge and Bromeliads form a private serene setting in the front yard for the future home of a Koi Fish Pond.



# Beach

## Hours of Operation

North Pompano Beach Boulevard & Atlantic Boulevard

The public beach is open 365 days a year. Swimming areas guarded 7 days a week 9 a.m. - 4:45 p.m. During day light savings the guards extend their coverage until 6:45 p.m. (early March to early September).

Restroom facilities, showers, picnic shelter and tables, barbecue grills, beach wheelchairs, and children's playground are located on the beach.

The Municipal Pier, 222 N. Pompano Beach Boulevard, is open 24 hours a day. Food and beverages can be purchased at the Pier Concession.

The public beach has two beach wheelchairs which make the beach accessible to our special needs residents and visitors. The beach chairs are available seven days a week on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information go to Ocean Rescue Headquarters (50 N. Pompano Beach Blvd.) or ask any lifeguard.

## Ocean Rescue

Pompano Beach Ocean Rescue is a division of Pompano Beach Fire Rescue. The beach patrol consists of 17 full-time and 35 part-time highly trained men and women who protect swimmers along 1,200 yards of beach. All of our ocean lifeguards are certified First Responders or Emergency Medical Technicians who are trained to handle any emergency and are equipped with full basic life support equipment such as AED's and oxygen. Our agency's lifeguard certification is provided through the United States Lifesaving Association. Ocean Rescue lifeguards receive additional training with Pompano Beach Fire Rescue. Our ocean lifeguards also have extensive knowledge of the ocean and beach environment and are always happy to answer questions from the public.

## Special Considerations

Boogie boarding is allowed everywhere on the beach, however, surfing is only allowed in designated areas. Wrist or ankle leashes are mandatory. Stand up paddleboards have been interpreted to be the same as surfboards if inside the vessel exclusion buoys. Launching for stand up paddleboards is north of Lifeguard Tower 6 located on the north side of the municipal pier or south of Lifeguard Tower 3 located at the eastern Atlantic Avenue terminus. No craft shall be operated at a distance closer than 100

yards (300 feet) of the municipal pier. Stand up paddleboarders outside the vessel exclusion buoys are required to wear a life vest

Hobie cats, kite boarders, paddle and wind driven vessels can be launched at NE 13<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> Streets only and must stay 100 yards off the public beach. Boats (both sail and motor) must also stay 100 yards off the public beach. Vessel exclusion buoys are an added visual reference.

Boat and Jet Ski launching is available at Alsdorf Park on NE 14th Street Causeway and the Intracoastal Waterway. A playground and picnic area is also available at this site.

## Beach Picnic Pavilions, Sand Volleyball and Soccer Courts

Pavilions and Courts are available on a first-come, first-served basis; however, to rent either one for a special activity, an application must be made at the Emma Lou Olson Civic Center. Info: 954.786.4111



# Flood Damage {Protect Your Home and Property}

This article is required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (F.E.M.A.) to satisfy provisions in the Community Rating System (C.R.S.) for reduced costs for flood insurance. The following is offered to Pompano Beach residents to help prevent and minimize the impact on lives and property caused by floodwaters.

## Flood Hazard Map

The City's Engineering Department has enhanced FEMA's Flood Criteria Map identifying flood zones for all properties in the city. The FEMA Flood Hazard Areas found within the City limits include Zone X, Zone AE, Zone AH, and Zone VE. The map depicts the flood hazard associated with any parcel in the City. A Summarized flood zones map is located in the Building Inspections Division at City Hall and is available in electronic GIS format.

## Flood Risk

Although we have been relatively fortunate for many years, the recent flooding on Halloween 2011 reminds us of the possibility of a flooding event without a major storm or hurricane. The risk of flooding within the City of Pompano Beach can increase by the presence of higher water levels within the Atlantic Ocean and the Intracoastal Waterway due to storm surge. In general, property located east of State Road A1A within the City has been designated as a coastal zone which encounters greater flooding risk due to waves and storm surge during a significant storm event.

## Flood Warning System

The City of Pompano Beach, in coordination with Broward County, has a warning system to notify residents of impending flood danger. Warnings will be transmitted on public address systems such as the City's website, CODE RED, television channel 78, telephone, and on a door-to-door basis. Listen for instructions during times of flood risk.

## Flood Safety

These are precautionary steps to consider before possible flooding:

- Listen to radio or television for warnings.
- Obey warning and evacuation instructions from disaster officials.
- Know your evacuation zone and route.
- Take your own essentials (food, toiletries, clothes, blankets, etc.).
- Turn off the electricity and gas before leaving your home.
- Bring a battery-operated flashlight.
- Be careful at all times, particularly at night, and try to remain calm.
- Do not drive through flooded roadways
- Do not walk through flowing waters
- Stay away from electrical wires

## Flood Insurance

Most homeowners' insurance policies do not cover property losses due to flood waters. To

insure your property for flood damage, you need a flood insurance policy. If you do not have valid flood insurance, contact an agent immediately. Property owners can insure property; renters can insure possessions. The City of Pompano Beach participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (N.F.I.P.) to provide city residents with the initial qualification to purchase flood insurance. Flood insurance typically covers the building structure but not the contents so verify your coverage for contents under your homeowner's insurance. Please note that there is a 30-day waiting period after purchase before NFIP flood insurance coverage takes effect. We applied to F.E.M.A. for participation in the C.R.S. program to enable our residents to qualify for lower flood insurance premiums.

## Property Protection

There are ways to minimize property losses from flood damage, including:

- Move furniture and other household valuables to rooms or spaces in the upper story of a two-story dwelling or a location higher than the regular floor elevation in a single story home.
- Place sandbags in strategic places around your property prior to flood status. When sandbags are placed correctly at proper locations, they can slow up and divert flood waters.
- Upgrading your property can include regarding your property to provide for on-site storage of stormwater runoff, installing an earthen berm along the perimeter, retrofitting the existing structure to be flood-proofed, or elevating the existing structure to raise the finish floor elevation.

## Development Permits

All development (new construction, additions, renovations, alterations to properties, etc.) in the City of Pompano Beach require a construction permit. The N.F.I.P. and the Florida Building Code require the entire building to conform to the requirements for a new building when building repairs or alterations exceed 50 percent of the building's market value. All applicable building permit applications must conform to this requirement when submitted to the Building Inspections Division. The requirement may also apply if a building is substantially damaged due to flooding. Before building on, altering, regarding, or replacing fill on your property, always check with the Building Division on any permit requirements. A permit may be required to ensure that the construction does not negatively impact adjacent properties. If an ongoing construction project within a City does not have a posted permit sign, please contact the City's Building Division to report the possible violation.

## Stormwater Management

Stormwater is managed through a system of pipes and drainage canals maintained regularly by our Public Works and Utilities Departments. The Broward County Office of Environmental Services and South Florida Water Management District. Constant water flow through these canals, especially during heavy storms, is essential to flood prevention in the City. City and state laws prohibit dumping trash in waterways. Report violators to Public Works Department at 954.786.4060.

## Natural Habitat

Natural areas of the City provide a beneficial function by the reducing the potential severity of flooding. These natural areas typically collect and retain stormwater runoff during rainfall events and allow for the infiltration of stormwater into the natural ground surface, which can reduce the flooding levels within the developed areas of the City. These natural areas also enhance the water quality of stormwater runoff by allowing suspended sediments and nutrients to settle during the retention period. State regulations protect those natural areas that help to reduce the risks associated with flooding. Along the beach, no new structures are permitted seaward of the Coastal Construction Line without permission. Other restrictions protect some wetland areas from development.

## Rate Reductions

On June 11<sup>th</sup>, 1993, F.E.M.A. awarded the City with a Class 9 rating in the C.R.S. This rating earned Pompano Beach residents a five percent discount on flood insurance premiums. In September 1994, the City received official notification that Pompano Beach residents are eligible for an additional five percent discount, or ten percent total, on flood insurance based on the City complying with the requirements for a Class 8 rating in the C.R.S. In July 2012, F.E.M.A. awarded the City a class 7 rating so flood insurance policy holders in special flood hazard areas in the City will now receive a 15% discount on their insurance premiums.

## Additional Information

We urge City residents to contact or visit the Building Inspections Division to determine the flood zone and flood elevation for their property. The library at the Building Inspections Division is available for your reference. Pompano Beach City Hall is at 100 West Atlantic Boulevard, Pompano Beach, Florida. The Pompano Beach Branch of the Broward County Library, located at 1213 East Atlantic Boulevard, has information on flood insurance, flood protection and flood plain management. 
